Be a Good Neighbor!



Do you think it's important to be kind to other people? Is that part of your worship? Jesus Christ taught it's how we treat other people that really reflects who we are in our own heart. (1) & (3) He also said learning to be a good neighbor means your very life. (38)

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Do you know what the Bible teaches about being kind to others (about being neighborly)? Jesus said the whole of the Bible actually exists to teach us exactly that: how to be good neighbors.⁽²⁾

A young man approached Christ some 2000 years ago and asked him what God's most important commandment was. Jesus said the man needed simply to love God and to love his neighbor as himself. Jesus also said everything contained in the Bible is for the purpose of teaching us to love God and neighbor. The young man, however, wanting to feel justified in his existing religious course of life, went on to ask Jesus who really was his neighbor. Jesus explained being a good neighbor, or having love for others, amounts to the visible expression of what is in our heart as we extend kindness and help to others when we recognize they need

it.³ The man asking Jesus this question was a Jew. Now the Jews looked down on Samaritans as a lower caste people. [The Samaritans were Jews who were mixed race and could not trace their heritage back to Abraham.] So... In the example Jesus gave this young Jewish man,⁽³⁾ he chose a Samaritan as the man who demonstrated loving kindness. Extending kindness to others, when done out of love, is not based on who the person is or on what they represent. True love transcends human bigotry.

Now that we have considered Jesus's Bible example teaching us what or who a good neighbor is,^{(1) & (3)} let us also examine a real life example of a "really bad neighbor." As we do so, please consider how someone can imagine themselves righteous in God's eyes even when they are showing hatred for others. A bad neighbor is simply any person who doesn't care about other people. A really bad neighbor is a person who doesn't care about others, and, is actually able to imagine he is made righteous by the act of showing hatred for others. A Bible example of a really

bad neighbor is Saul of Tarsus. Saul is unusual because he was a man who manifest some of the most vile and hateful actions ever taken, but, he also demonstrated outstanding loving-kindness toward others. Saul appears in the Bible record shortly after Jesus was resurrected to heaven.⁴ As one of the religious leaders of Jesus's day, Saul was full of hate for those not sharing what he was convinced was "the one true faith," and, he was busying himself with persecuting Jesus's followers.⁵ One of Jesus's early followers was a man named Stephen. Saul, acting as a Pharisee, stood in charge of those putting Stephen to death.⁶ In the Bible

from my early years, as it was from the start among my nation, and at Jerusalem; (5) And they are able to say, if they would give witness, that I was living as a Pharisee, in that division of our religion which is most regular in the keeping of the law.

6 Acts 7:51-60 ESV [Stephen's response] "You stiff-necked people, uncircumcised in heart and ears, you always resist the Holy Spirit. As your fathers did, so do you. (52) Which of the prophets did your fathers not persecute? And they killed those who announced beforehand the coming of the Righteous One [Jesus Christ], whom you have now betrayed and murdered, (53) you who received the law as delivered by angels and did not keep it." (54) Now when they heard these things they were enraged, and they ground their teeth at him. (55) But he, full of the Holy Spirit, gazed into heaven and saw the glory of God, and Jesus standing at the right

account of Stephen's murder, witnesses recounted that his face appeared as that of an angel. That likely means his face emitted rays, or glowed in some way. His appearance, along with the eloquent witness Stephen gave before his tormentors was irrefutable. Even still, disregarding the evidence that Stephen was righteous, Saul led the religious mob in stoning Stephen to death. This is the point we want you to take from considering this example: Saul was able to imagine himself righteous and serving God even as he killed upright Stephen. Thus... Saul provides an example of a really bad neighbor! Saul felt no compassion to tolerate the life of Stephen, and, he felt no remorse over his death. After he killed Stephen, Saul continued his wicked course of attacking the followers of Christ. Now we come to something

that might seem inconsistent in this Bible drama. Saul, this man acting without compassion against the innocent followers of Jesus, is reached out to by Christ to become his follower. ¹⁰ Why

that if there were any of the Way there, men or women, he might take them as prisoners to Jerusalem.

¹⁰ Acts 9:3-22 GNB As Saul was coming near the city of Damascus, suddenly a light from the sky flashed around him. (4) He fell to the ground and heard a voice saying to him, "Saul, Saul! (18) At once something like fish scales fell from Saul's eyes, and he was able to see again. He stood up and was baptized; (19) and after he had eaten, his strength came back. Saul stayed for a few days with the believers in Damascus. (20) He went straight to the synagogues and began to preach that Jesus was the Son of God. (21) All who heard him were amazed and asked, "Isn't he the one who in Jerusalem was

would Christ choose one behaving so wickedly to serve God? Even though Saul's actions were as terrible as any person could imagine, we can know Saul's heart must have been upright because of the very fact that Jesus selected him to become his follower. Jesus converted murderous Saul to Christianity, and, known from then forward as the Apostle Paul, he was used to write more books of the Bible than any other man. The question that remains is this: How could a man who was sincerely trying to serve God have been so wicked in his actions? The answer is really simple! And, if you put forth the effort to understand, the answer provides you a great protection you might not otherwise even know you need! (26) Even though he was very religious, Saul was a "worker of lawlessness" because he had been misled by the teachings of unrighteous religious men. The men he followed claimed to be servants of God and teachers of the Law of Moses (and of the Hebrew scriptures) but they were not! We know they were not because those very scriptures contained prophecies that indicated the coming Messiah. 11 When Jesus presented himself as the Messiah their scriptures promised, they should have recognized and welcomed him. Rather, it was those self-righteous religious zealots who actually killed Christ, as well as directing Saul to kill Stephen. Saul was not only a member of that clan, he was a Pharisee (a sect of the Jewish religious leaders – literally meaning "Separated Ones; Separatists."). After Saul's conversion to Christianity, however, Saul/Paul served Christ faithfully for the rest of his life. 12 A sobering question in the mind of each person

should be this: Is religion still deceiving people the same way they did in Paul's day? Yes, yes, yes...⁽¹⁵⁾

False religious teachers, along with their recruitment activities, are still rampant in our world. A man recently filmed himself cutting the head off another man (a living man). Then, he proudly and arrogantly published the video for all the world to witness his great faith in the God he proudly professed. You should realize the terrible danger that is both real and responsible for such activity. Religion is very dangerous! And... Religion is completely different from Christianity. The difference is simple: Religionists follow other men while Christians follow, well, Christ (of course). The problem we illustrate is that it can be hard to follow Christ if you aren't cautious to avoid being deceived by religionists. Please take note, however, Jesus Christ did give you clear warning about religion. Some of the men and women who cause harm to other people, or who support those who do

so, have been tricked to imagine they are serving God by their acts of violence and hate. 14 Some claim to actually believe God will bless them for such activity. How can people be so completely deceived? They are deceived in exactly the same way Paul was! It has been happening since Jesus left. About three or four hundred years after Jesus was resurrected, the apostate Christian Church (religion) was already active. Their activities brought to birth what is today referred to as the Dark Ages (* - page 2) as they actually hid the Bible from common people. Just as modern day religion still does, those apostate but self-proclaimed Christians did unimaginable things to other men and women. Starting about 300 or 400 AD, they force-converted large groups of mankind to what they imagined to be "Christianity." They used the point of a sword to "encourage" them. As a conversion and/or disciplinary tool, they devised machines to bring about the most horrible and drawn out methods of killing people they could conceive. Those they rendered judgment over were then executed by religious leaders using those methods; in public for all to see. Sometimes they took days to torture someone to death. It was alright (actually good) in their mind, though, because they were killing people they arrogantly judged to be enemies of God. During those Dark Ages, apostate Christianity became the world government when they joined with Rome to create the supposed "Holy Roman" Church State." History allows us to look back and see what "the church" did to mankind during those dark years. [It took about 1000 years before the church's true identity started being exposed and the Dark Ages began to evaporate into the light of truth. That light was brought by the common language translations of the Bible (done by ex-members who recognized

what the apostate church actually was) in 1300 to 1400 AD. The apostate church had kept the Bible hidden from common men and women for that 1000 years, by keeping it in the dead language of Latin. A lay person having possession of a Bible was punishable by death. The Churches priesthood attended special schools to learn to read the Latin Bibles. Their religious schools also taught them how to use the Bible to manipulate people which was the extent of what the apostate church really wanted their priesthood to know about it. Some members who learned the truth from the Bible, however, the truth the church was trying to keep hidden, openly protested against the dark churches sins thus making themselves Protestants. Most of those Protestants who broke from the church's doctrine and started new groups, however, soon abandoned the Bible and returned to following some other doctrine dreamt up by men. (That is the great failing of group worship. Christianity is the worship of God through personal faith in the teachings of Christ Jesus; by individuals.) The reformation (or Protestant) movement did, however, make the Bible available to the masses. It was all leading to our day in time. (* - page 2) Most anyone who has an interest in truth can gain access to a Bible today.] Because of the historical record of her crimes, exposing the true hatred of that ancient false church, modern day sects of the self-proclaimed "Christian" religions have learned to present an appearance of being more tolerant. (13) They claim to promote love and peace. Behind their facade, however, most of them still maintain shunning, disfellowshipping, or excommunication practices. By those judgments, (20) they cause as much emotional harm to people they judge wicked as our modern laws allow. If you live in a nation with laws affording a measure of religious freedom, you should thank God you are being protected from sectarian religious zealots. We see all the hundreds of thousands of people religious groups are killing where no such governmental protections exist. Even in "protected nations," however, religion still destroys marriages and even separates children from parents: Doing so by disfellowshipping or excommunicating them. People have killed themselves after being judged wicked by some of these groups. Even for religious sects who don't practice those modern "shunning" forms of torture, their very process of public membership approval is in itself a judgment that non-members are lost to God, or, that they don't measure up in God's judgment. Who do they really imagine they are, to think they can judge who is Christian and who is not? They judge and divide people by means of those caste systems of membership appointments. Many of them teach non-members are unworthy of life. If a sincere and good hearted man like Paul could have been deceived by false religion, to the point of actually taking self-righteous pride in the murder of innocents, what can protect you against being deceived? How can you be sure you haven't already been misled? Constantly examining whether you are a good neighbor is one thing that can help protect you. If you are being led by a group who will cut off someone's head, you should know you are not being helped to be a good neighbor (a Christian). That's pretty obvious to most people, right? (13) If, however, you are being urged to join in sectarian judgments against others, you are all the same being radicalized away from what Jesus taught. Their veiled hatred, manifest in the judgment of exclusion against those they don't approve or bless as members, can be harder to spot as being bad because modern religions have gotten better at hiding who they really are. 15 We

are not implying people should not be judged at all. We just all need to understand it is God is judging everyone, and how He is doing it: We are each one of us, individually, judging our-ownselves by our response to what Jesus taught. (65) Jesus there said (in Mat 24:15) we would be able to see (by being discerning) the "Horrible Thing causing desolation standing in a holy place." False religion stands in a "holy place" by pretending to teach what God wants us to know - most even claim to teach what Jesus taught. Really, however, what they are still doing is hiding the Bible from their sheep. Rather than keeping the Bible hidden in a dead language, however, today's religionists hide the Bible in plain sight: By glorifying what they call Bible study aids. They keep their flock's Bibles out of use as they brainwash them to follow along in their own organizationally produced writings, deceiving them to believe that is studying the Bible. (22) They do use the Bible to pick and choose scriptures they have selected in support of their doctrine, of course. Studying the Bible, however, means actually reading the Bible. Is that really too hard to understand? The same applies to this booklet. You can't be sure you aren't being deceived as you read this booklet. The great difference is this: We encourage that you first read the booklet (noting well over half of it is comprised of scriptures), and then, read one of the Gospels to see if this isn't precisely what Jesus was teaching. That's how you can know you aren't being deceived. And... It's the

one and only way you can really know you are safe! We all need to learn what Jesus spent his time, and his very life, teaching. We can't really do that jumping around in the Bible picking this scripture and that. Read the Gospels through! The apostate churches have thus made themselves the "Horrible Thing causing desolation," because their false and sectarian teachings only cause division and hatred and destruction. Your protection lies in your simply learning for yourself what Jesus taught. It's not hard, but, you do have to be careful. The judgmental teachings of apostates were already starting to appear while Jesus was still alive on earth. Some of his followers came to him, asking him to rebuke a man because the man was using Jesus's name but wasn't "following after them." Jesus warned them not to be judgmental that way.

recommend that everyone be very careful about joining with any sect in rendering judgment others are wicked.²⁰ So... We say pray again and always, simply read for yourself what Jesus Christ taught (contained in the four short Gospels penned by Matthew, Mark, Luke and John). Become a Christian by personally following what you know Jesus's taught!

People who care about other people are by nature nice people. They naturally try not to do anything that will harm others. They not only don't harm other people, however, they try to help. In the mind of those who are egotistically selfish and/or religious, such "nice" people are silly and weak, or even stupid. Self-centered people believe everyone is just like them. So... They think when people don't behave like them, it is because those people are just not capable of being "cunning and conniving" like they are. (52) When such un-neighborly people can band into a sect of religionists (or form any group really) they become very dangerous. When they share the sectarian conviction they are a part of God's chosen and true followers, or that they are among the "wise and righteous people who are helping society," they feel free to express their hatred of everyone who is not like them.

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²⁰ 1 Corinthians 4:1-5 GNB (1) You should think of us as Christ's servants, who have been put in charge of God's secret truths [the teaching of Jesus]. (2) The one thing required of such servants is that they be faithful to their master. Such thinking is an insidious and infectious disease.²¹ Kind hearted people are drawn toward groups, however, because we all want to be liked and to have friends. We all want to be part of something bigger than ourselves. Also, we are drawn to sects because most of those groups call God's and/or Christ's name over their group. Most of them pretend to be upright and kind. Most also claim to be Bible students and followers of Jesus, Some of them are really good at enticing potential good neighbors to membership.²² Members are then gradually encouraged to follow group teachings and to express judgment and hatred against nonmembers, all in the name of the God their cult claims to worship. Just knowing and using God's and/or Jesus's name is not a protection.²³ Jesus said we have to hear, and to do, what he

Christians believe they should learn and follow what Jesus taught, and they learn tolerance of others from him. Jesus said even God's perfect law code was subject to his expressions of love.²⁵ That law was given by God to protect

mankind until the Christ arrived. Jesus was the Messiah sent to help mankind (to teach us what God wants us to know)(48) far more than the Law. Faith in Christ has become our protection! (32 - Galatians 3:24) If God's perfect law was replaced or fulfilled by faith in Christ, the modern laws created by cults of men are worthless at best (and mostly destructive). When the teachings of misguided but self-righteous religious men are not being undermined and broken up by the true teachings of Jesus Christ, sects of men are able to gather kind hearted people who will then wholeheartedly assist them in their attack on other righteous men and women. That is what happened to the Apostle Paul in his youth. What false religion can thus cause to happen is for kind-hearted people to be attacking and fighting against other kind-hearted (potentially neighborly) people. Like Paul, those who are deceived and at the same time able to remain self-righteous will cause great harm. Their puppeteers take a seat off to the side and cheer them on. The one controlling them all, of course, is Satan. (50) Only the teachings of God's son can set you free 26 of being led along on the wrong side in this warfare. It is the warfare that is destroying the world as we know it.²⁷

Paul himself worked hard to help us understand the problem we all face. Even after his conversion to Christianity, Paul found it a struggle to do the right thing.⁽³³⁾ He was still inclined to be led along by men who possibly meant well, but were either misled or had no interest in doing things according to Jesus's teachings.³²

need to learn for yourself what Jesus taught. We mention your dependence on Christ's teachings repeatedly because it seems hard for many people to comprehend what "listening to Jesus" really means! That is likely because we have so many people telling us what they think Jesus said, and what they think he wants us to do. Have you ever, however, had even one of those people (or groups) simply sit down with you and actually read through the Gospel accounts of Jesus's teachings?³⁴ Please realize that to be the very simple but clear difference between our effort, and the barrage of religious activity prodding you from all sides. Even though Paul was evidently sincere at heart in his youth, he refused to allow himself to be corrected from his badness, except by the drastic action taken by Christ Jesus himself. Paul arrogantly refused to pay attention to the witness given by Stephen during the ordeal of Stephen's death. Jesus, however, struck Paul blind to get his attention. (10) Paul thus had to endure some period of time wondering if his blindness was permanent. Don't make our Lord take such drastic action with you. We are (or can be) more fortunate than Paul! We have the recording of how Jesus dealt with Paul. We can read what Jesus said and did to him, and understand why. We also have the examples of how Jesus dealt with lots and lots of other people. By reading those accounts, we can gain much of the benefit each of those individuals gained by their own personal experiences with Jesus. That is how you gain protection from being deceived by any of the oh-so-many religious teachers; all of whom, just like young Saul/Paul, imagine themselves true servants of God. Simply sit at the feet of Jesus by reading the Gospel accounts of his life. 35 Jesus will help you in



should begin to understand: Becoming a good neighbor is what happens to all people with faith in truth. If you want to build a faith that can help you, you must read the Gospels. Not just once, but enough to become friends with Jesus and with those he loved. You need to "live" within the Gospel pages that recount the interactions Jesus had with the people of his day. In those Gospels exist the world of reality. The world system that surrounds us, and appears to our eyes, is a mist that is fading away. 46 & (61) As you feed on the teachings of Jesus, his friends can become your friends.⁴⁷ Make no mistake, however, if you are kind hearted, those who choose to make themselves enemies of Christian principles will most assuredly hate you. Choose for yourself the most valuable thing in life; doing so by electing to sit at the feet of Jesus. (35) To protect yourself from being misled or hurt, most of the interaction you have with people outside Bible study should be for the purpose of extending neighborly love to them. (If it seems unfair that you are caught in the midst of all this turmoil; it is. Remember, however, it is the enemies of God who brought this war. What God has done is make a way of protection

Then we will see very clearly. Now my knowledge is incomplete. Then I will have complete knowledge as God has complete knowledge of me. (13) So these three things remain: faith, hope, and love. But the best one of these is love.

People you come in contact with don't have to appear self-righteous and religious to be your enemies. This whole world lies in the power of the wicked one. ⁵⁰ People who believe they have responsibility for controlling society so as to manage the social order, are just as dangerous as religious zealots. If you fall outside the scope of what they judge to be acceptable, or normal, they will take any action they can devise to correct or punish you. They are in their

imagination, after all, gifts to protect mankind. They are often amazingly good in their abilities to figure out how to do harm, but, that should not surprise anyone. (27) (When Jesus was arrested, the religious leaders brought him before Pilate [the Roman governor of Judeal for condemnation. They did so because they didn't have governmental authority to put Jesus to death themselves. Pilate seemed hesitant about killing Jesus. As it "worked out," however, Herod [King of Judea – also supported by Romel was in Jerusalem, so Pilate was able to send Jesus to Herod. Herod abused Jesus and sent him back to Pilate, thus encouraging Pilate in his decision to put Christ to death. It might seem amazing to some people how the religious leaders and Pilate and Herod were all able to work together to affect their goal to kill Jesus. Herod and Pilate were actually made friends by the ordeal.⁵¹ It was, of course, Satan who made it all fit together for them. There was nothing special about any of them. realize: Everyone functions either in the spirit of God, or in the spirit of the world (which is also the spirit of the Devil). (50) If you are meek and kind hearted, contact with you will be painful for people who have the spirit of this world. They won't like you.⁵² That is why Jesus said you should limit your contact to your efforts in trying to help them see the truth. (57) Expecting people who don't really know Jesus to show love for you is like expecting a man born blind to tell you what color your shirt is. It is not something they can even comprehend. It doesn't necessarily mean they are bad people, possibly just ignorant or deceived; like Paul was. The only way any of us can understand what love is, and then show it for others, is by first recognizing the love God has shown for us in Christ.⁵³ If you are kind hearted, the world will hate you simply because you are not like them. (52) They may actually become friends with each other over their hatred of you.⁵⁴ The only people who truly are kind hearted are the

to be un-neighborly.⁵⁷ That makes clear one thing you should not do is mope around and be upset because such people don't like you, or because they say bad things about you.⁵⁸ If you worry about what people think of you, you will be trying to please them.⁵⁹ Some people are mean and say bad things precisely because they want to control you, by getting you to spend your time and energy reacting to them. Or, they do it because they want to impress and please other people. Mean spirited people

don't seem to realize: Most people recognize ignorant and/or hateful persons for just what they are. A life immersed in the teachings of Jesus is the only thing that can protect your heart against being influenced by any and all people who hate what is good. They might, of course, still grab you up to insult you, or even to cut off your head (in their badness or their ignorance). Their imagined glory will be short lived.⁶⁰ Remember too, as God sees fit, He can protect you from all harm.⁶¹ Your faith will most assuredly impact what protection you receive. Within the Gospel

pages you can find protection and happiness.⁶² Also, they contain the hope of living forever. Not just in your mind and heart, but in the current revelation of God's purpose to repair what Satan has done.⁽⁴³⁾ The kingdom of Christ really is being established!⁶³ It is evident in part by the continuing escalation of violence and hate in the world.⁽¹⁵⁾ You need simply choose if you are becoming part of God's new world. Jesus not only came to teach us what his Father wanted us to know,⁽⁴⁸⁾ he also came to

separate those who are gaining life (by building faith in him) from those who are choosing to continue dying.^{64 & (67)} There are untold religious sects, but there are actually only two groups you can be part of. Each of us is being separated to one group or the other by how we respond to Jesus's words.⁶⁵ If you ignore the teachings of Jesus Christ, you will continue being led along with the spirit⁶⁶ of this world and you will die in your sins.⁶⁷ Don't be foolish enough to rely on what people say Jesus taught.⁽²³⁾ Choose life!⁶⁸ Read the

Let's summarize the scriptures we have considered and how they illuminate the Bible theme. (38) Jesus said he came for the purpose of telling us the truth, and that all righteous people would give ear to his teachings. 73 He said the most important thing we can learn is to love God with all our heart, and our neighbor as ourselves. He also said the law and the prophets (the Old Testament or Hebrew Scriptures) exist to teach us how to show that love. (2) His followers taught the Old Testament (the law and the prophets) actually existed to be our tutor leading to the Christ. (32 - Galatians 3:24) We also realize the Bible books written after the Gospels were written after Jesus was gone (after he had been resurrected to heaven, or, after what he came to teach had already been recorded). The books following the Gospels are not the teachings of Jesus. The books following the Gospels were inspired by God to be written by the followers of Jesus, as they recorded how they did their best to apply his teachings in their lives. Those books too, direct us to Christ. This is not hard to understand!!! What God sent his son to teach vou is recorded in the four short Bible books of Matthew, Mark, Luke and John.

The rest of the Bible is a tutor to help you understand and have faith in that knowledge. (32) Once we individually come to understand that simple Bible theme, our energies should be focused in trying every day of our life to better understand what Jesus taught. That's how we can come to know Jesus intimately, and, it is the only way we can be certain we are not misled by well-meaning but ignorant men. Remember: In his youth, the Apostle Paul was convinced he was upright even while he was teaching others to torment and kill the followers of Jesus. (9) Although Paul had good intentions, he was completely ignorant of Jesus's teachings, and so, he remained a worker of lawlessness. (12) Once you realize the importance of truly understanding what Jesus taught, you need to start building a detailed knowledge of what that is. Jesus said what we have faith in would become our reality, or, that our lives would happen according to our faith. (42) As we have faith in the promises of God, those promises will come true for us. Or, viewed another way, God's promises are coming true and we need to figure out how we can fit in. Do you begin to glean how very important it is to know what God has promised? What God has promised is impacted by where we live in time. When a woman approached Jesus 2000 years ago, she had faith she could be healed from a terrible and humiliating illness by just touching his outer garment. It happened exactly as her faith led her to believe it would.⁷⁴ The first appearance of the Messiah was

Mark 5:25-34 CEV In the crowd was a woman who had been bleeding for twelve years. (26) She had gone to many doctors, and they had not done anything except cause her a lot of pain. She had paid them all the money she had. But instead of getting better, she only got worse. (27) The woman had heard about Jesus, so she came up behind him in the crowd and barely touched his clothes. (28) She had said to herself, "If I can just touch his clothes, I will get well." (29) As soon as she touched them, her bleeding stopped, and she knew she was well. (30) At that moment Jesus felt power go out from him. He turned to the crowd and asked, "Who touched my clothes?" (31) His disciples said to him, "Look at all these people crowding around you! How can you ask who touched you?" (32) But Jesus turned to see who had

what God purposed for the time period in which that woman lived. Her manifest faith was only (and could only possibly be) in what "she could know" God had promised. Her faith didn't grant her a return to her youth and eternal health. (43) She continued to get old, and then died, like everyone else in her day. (As a person of faith, she is, of course, awaiting the resurrection.)(44) She didn't have enough Bible knowledge to have faith in the hope of growing young and living forever. (43) She couldn't know to have such faith because it wasn't God's time for her to understand that promise, or, for it to be fulfilled. There was no reason to grant her a hope in what it was not time for her to be able to realize. There would have been no kindness in doing so. She served her purpose in building her own faith in what she did know God had promised, and in being healed by that faith. She then had her wonderful example recorded to build faith in millions (or billions) of others. (40) Our day in time is for the second coming of Christ, and, it is time for the promises of God that are reserved for our day to be revealed and realized. Those promises are becoming reality. Persons who have made the effort to gain the Bible knowledge needed to have faith in those promises will be blessed by that reality. Those who choose to ignore the truth will probably not. The only question for you is this: Are you going to believe all the religious hogwash and foolishness you have been brainwashed with all your life. Will you continue to believe religious leaders who have been telling what they think Jesus taught; or, are you going to immerse yourself in the Gospels and build faith in what Jesus really did teach? Do not think it is ever a matter of who means well. (23) Many or even most of the religious sects may mean well. Paul meant well when he killed Stephen. (7) & (6) If sects or individuals are causing pain and harm to others, the fact they mean well has no impact on the fruit they produce. (23) It is a

(52) Then the people said, "Now we are sure that you have a demon. Abraham is dead, and so are the prophets. How can you say that no one who obeys your words will ever die? (53) Are you greater than our father Abraham? He died, and so did the prophets. Who do you think you are?" (54) Jesus replied, "If I honored myself, it would mean nothing. My Father is the one who honors me. You claim that he is your God, (55) even though you don't really know him. If I said I didn't know him, I would be a liar, just like all of you. But I know him, and I do what he says.

is!^{76 & (20) & (38)} If this material can help you comprehend your dependence on reading for yourself what Jesus taught, it has served its purpose. You don't need us, or any sect of men. You need the Gospels. The recordings of Jesus's life and teachings, by Matthew, Mark, Luke and John, are the manifestation of God's effort to help you.^{(72) & (65)}

We are not self-righteous and arrogant to assert or imagine you need to agree with everything we say. Over half the material presented, however, is comprised of scriptures as footnotes. While you don't need to agree with what we say, we do observe your need to put faith in what Jesus Christ said. (38) Thus, we summarize and close by respectfully parroting the words of the Apostle Saul/Paul when he said: (1 Corinthians 4:1-6) Let a man so appraise us as being subordinates of Christ and stewards of sacred secrets [the teachings of Jesus] (77) of God. ² Besides, in this case, what is looked for in stewards is for a man to be found faithful. 3 Now to me it is a very trivial matter that I should be examined by you or by a human tribunal. Even I do not examine myself. 4 For I am not conscious of anything against myself [or, aware that I am doing anything against God]. Yet by this I am not proved righteous, but he that examines me is God. ⁵ Hence do not judge anything before the due time, until the Lord comes, who will both bring the secret things of darkness to light and make the counsels of the hearts manifest, and then each one will have his praise come to him from God. ⁶ Now, brothers, these things I have transferred so as to apply to myself and A pol'los for YOUR good, that in our case YOU may learn the [rule]: "Do not go beyond the things that are written (the teachings of Jesus)," in order that YOU may not be puffed up individually in favor of the one against the other.

I have faith everything I herein proclaim is consistent with what Jesus Christ taught. I also realize, what I say only amounts to the representation of who I am as a Christian. If I am in error, and I am sincere, Christ will correct me as he did Saul/Paul. What's important for you, in any case, is for you to exhibit who you are as

a Christian. You must do so based on your personal knowledge of what Jesus taught. Don't follow or build your faith in these writings. We freely acknowledge their only purpose is to help you identify your need to study at the feet of Jesus - by reading the Gospels for yourself. (35) Directing you to the teachings of Jesus is the whole purpose of justbibletruth.com. Even faithful angels are fearful of men becoming followers of them.⁷⁸ How much more so a man. We encourage your faith only in what Jesus said. That does include passing along Jesus's warning about the danger you face from the many sectarian groups trying to convince deceive you to believe your hope lies in a membership in their cult. The only membership that can help you, is in being among those individuals making a personal effort to follow what Jesus said. (47) Jesus started that group 2000 years ago, and persons were made part of it by following along listening to what he said. Today, we become part of the group Jesus started the same way, by reading what he said and following his guidance. Remember concerning

false teachers, Jesus did warn you of their prevalence and the great danger they pose. (15)

Please consider some examples of the danger of false religious teachers. Try not to feel compelled to take a side! The Bible says God created all things in six days. Literalists say that was six 24 hour days, while others say it was six creative days, meaning some uncertain and/or longer period of time. An example of such longer days would be "the day of Noah" or "the day of the pharaohs." You can't possibly know who is right because the Bible doesn't clearly state one way or the other. Scientists tell us there are dinosaur bones that are millions of years old. True scientists (people who study how to make use of the creation our Father has given us) are very smart people. They are the reason mankind has a satellite circling Jupiter sending back pictures and information. Most true scientists probably believe in God. Albert Einstein once commented on the consistency of science by saying: "God does not play dice with the universe." What scientists cannot do, however, is go back 1000 or even 100 years to validate their carbon dating procedures. There are factors they can't possibly test that could set their test results off by orders of magnitude. They certainly can't know it is accurate over millions of years. The reason we mention this is to note some of these people are right, and some of them are wrong. The very important point we make is this: You can't know who is wrong and who is right. Please consider, however, that it doesn't really matter. The choice before you, and your task of life approved by God, is building faith in what Jesus Christ was sent to teach. (65) How long a creative day was, and how old our earth is, has absolutely nothing to do with your understanding what Jesus taught. As other examples: Some Bible translators say Jesus died nailed to a stake or tree (the trunk of a tree from which a pole was cut), while others say he was nailed to a cross. Some say God is a trinity, and others a theocracy. Please notice that neither of the words trinity or theocracy even appear in the Bible. Where, then, did those words come from? From men who made them up

to explain their "doctrine." They build religious sects based on the doctrines they create, and then judge everyone who doesn't join them as lost to God. Just please realize: All these religious doctrines, many needing words to explain them that don't even appear in the Bible, have no bearing on what Jesus came to do and teach. Don't be so bold or foolish as to join one of these sects, and then to render judgment those who don't join you are wrong and bad. This is the simple truth of it: If you pick a side on religious issues that the Bible doesn't make clear, and you are wrong, it makes you a false religious teacher. (23) Just learn what Jesus Christ taught, and you have something reliable and good to teach. Be cautious not to be let people mislead you to say more than Jesus taught. (Page 42 - 1 Cor 4:6) You don't have to fight with people. Simply point them to what Jesus said. By referring them to Jesus, you make it their responsibility to take it up with him. Don't join with those who are dying as they waste themselves with debating philosophies of men. 79 The Bible doesn't tell you

everything. What it does tell you, however, is *everything* you need to know to gain life. Jesus came to teach you precisely that.

Our encouragement is not to be obedient to our Creator because you fear him. Be obedient because you fear displeasing him. That's an important distinction! Just realize: Everything our God tells us is for our protection and elevation. What that means is this: If you have anything in the secret parts of your mind that you believe will make you happy, and it is something against the will and purpose of God, you have believed a lie. It positively will not make you happy. It is like someone who is lost to using drugs or alcohol, always looking for that one great high but never finding it. The reason they can never find it is because it doesn't exist! God is the one teaching us to benefit ourselves, and that includes how to be happy. As you come to have faith that really is true, you will be driven to obey what he sent his son to teach. Read the Gospels! Take to heart what Isaiah said as he prophetically gave voice to the then future Christ or Messiah (the Greek [Christ] and Hebrew [Messiah] words, both of which mean "Anointed One"): Isaiah 48:16-19 ESV Draw near to me, hear this: from the beginning I have not spoken in secret, from the time it came to be
