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# How Can Faith Help?

Six thousand years ago in the Garden of Eden, by their deliberate choice to disobey our Creator, mankind set themselves on the path to destruction. The tribulation\*<sup>B</sup> of our day is the direct result of that bad choice. God knew where our disobedience would lead. He has been organizing our rescue during those six millennia. The Bible is a simple book provided by God to explain how to take advantage of his provision for life. The Bible gives hope by teaching you can build a faith that will preserve you alive. (Heb 10:38-39 on pg 27) The complicated philosophies of men have made the Bible seem difficult. Jesus said his easy words would set you free of the worry of being deceived. (131) & (95) Take the opportunity to learn and appreciate the value of faith in truth!

\*A Daniel 6:1-26 Literal Version (LITV) It pleased Darius [the Median king of Babylon shortly after Babylon was conquered by the Medes and Persians about 539 BCE1 to set over the kingdom a hundred and twenty satraps [aovernors]. that they might be over the kingdom. (2) And over them were three presidents (Daniel was one of them), so that these satraps might give account to them, and the king should have no loss. (3) Then this Daniel was preferred above the presidents and satraps, because an excellent spirit was in him. And the king was planning to set him over all the kingdom. (4) Then the presidents and satraps sought to find occasion against Daniel concerning the kingdom. But they could find no occasion or fault because he was trustworthy. And no error or fault was found in him. (5) Then these men said, We shall not find any occasion against this Daniel unless we find it against him concerning the Law of his God. (8) Now, O king, establish the decree and sign the document, so that it may not be changed, according to the law of the Medes and Persians, which does not pass away. (9) All on account of this, King Darius signed the document and the decree. (10) And when he had learned that the document was signed, Daniel went to his house. And his windows were open in his roof room toward Jerusalem. He knelt on his knees three times in the day, and prayed and praised before his God, as he did before. (11) Then these men met together and found Daniel praying and seeking mercy before his God. (12) Then they came near and spoke before the king concerning the king's decree. saying. Have you not signed a decree that every man who shall ask of any god or man within thirty days, except of you, O king, that he shall be thrown into the lions' den? The king answered and said, The thing is certain, according to the law of the Medes and Persians, which does not pass away. (13) Then they answered and said before the king. Daniel, who is of the sons of the exile of Judah, has not set attention on you, O king, or the decree that you have signed, but he makes his prayer three times in the day. (14) Then the king, when he heard the word, was very displeased with himself, and he set his heart on Daniel, to deliver him. And he labored until the going of the sun to deliver him. (15) Then these men met before the king and said to the king. O king, know that the law of the Medes and Persians is that every decree or law which the king enacts may not be changed. (16) And the king commanded. And they brought Daniel, and they threw him into the lions' den. The king spoke and said to Daniel, Your God whom you constantly serve will deliver you. (17) And a stone was brought and laid on the mouth of the den. And the king sealed it with his own signet, and with the signet of his nobles, that the affair may not change concerning Daniel. (18) Then the king went to his palace and spent the night fasting; and diversions were not brought before him; and his sleep fled from him. (19) Then the king rose up in the dawn, in the daylight, and hurried to the lions' den. (20) And when he came to the den, he cried with a grieved voice to Daniel. The king spoke and said to Daniel, O Daniel, servant of the living God, your God whom you always serve, is He able to deliver you from the lions? (21) Then Daniel said to the king, O king, live forever. (22) My God has sent His Angel, and He has shut the mouths of the lions. And they have not harmed me, because in His sight innocence was found in me. And also before you, O king, I have done no harm. (23) Then the king was exceedingly glad over him. And he commanded to bring up Daniel from the den. And Daniel was brought out of the den, and no harm was found on him, because he trusted in his God. (24) And the king commanded, and they brought those

men who had accused Daniel. And they threw *them* into the lions' den, them, their sons and their wives. And the lions overpowered them and crushed all their bones before they reached to the bottom of the den. (25) Then King Darius wrote to all the peoples, the nations, and the languages who were living in all the earth: Peace be multiplied to you. (26) A decree was given from before me that in all the domain of my kingdom *there* shall be trembling and fear before the God of Daniel. For He *is* the living God and endures forever, and His kingdom *is* the one which shall not be destroyed. And His rule *shall be* to the end.

\*B Please realize: The tribulation Jesus warned us about,¹ and which is overwhelming our world in theses last days, is not an act of God. It is the result of our sustained and determined course in disobedience to the directions of our Creator. Rather than being the cause of the tribulation, God is helping those who will listen.² The Bible explains how He is helping. It is God's gift... You need to understand what it says if you are to exercise faith in God's promised deliverance.

¹ Matthew 24:7-14 CEV Nations and kingdoms will go to war against each other. People will starve to death, and in some places there will be earthquakes. (8) But this is just the beginning of troubles. (9) You will be arrested, punished, and even killed. Because of me, you will be hated by people of all nations. (10) Many will give up and will betray and hate each other. (11) Many false prophets will come and fool a lot of people. (12) Evil will spread and cause many people to stop loving others. Christ is alive<sup>(77)</sup> in the Gospel accounts of his teachings. Don't be fooled to look elsewhere.] (28) For wherever the carcase is, there will be gathered the eagles. [The remains of Christ, or his body or carcass, are his teachings.]

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What you are reading is the most important message you have ever considered.<sup>3</sup> Even if you are a long time Bible student, you might not have thought about the meaning of all the scriptures presented.

Please consider if... These scriptures demonstrate why it is not arrogant to draw attention to the importance of this message. After all, it's not important because it is *our* message. It is the message of Christ Jesus.

The reason you might not have gleaned this insight, even if you have already read the Bible, is *because it is only now being more fully understood* as the light from the scriptures grows brighter and brighter<sup>4</sup> (or, put another way, as mankind's understanding of the Bible becomes clearer in these last days). To get the full sense of the Scriptures, you must begin with an understanding that it matters where we live in the stream of the time it covers. If you had lived 3000 years ago, for example, you would have been living

among those still having to wait another thousand years for the Christ (or Messiah) to appear. The only acceptable way to worship God would have been through the Jewish Law Code and their Priesthood. You would have needed to be born a Jew, or to have become a Jewish proselyte.<sup>5</sup> It was the Jewish nation to whom many of the Messianic promises were made. Being a Jew or proselyte were the only two acceptable choices for pleasing God 3000 years ago, even as the Bible explains.<sup>6</sup> Also, you must really understand<sup>7</sup> the Bible if you are to truly believe (have faith) in it. It

הוה (יד) with you, every man and boy in that family must first be circumcised. Then they may join in the meal, just like native Israelites. No uncircumcised man or boy may eat the Passover meal! (49) One law exists for both native Israelites and to those foreigners who live among you [and express faith by being circumsized – Jewish proselytes].~

Those foreigners or alien residents later came to be called proselytes:

Matthew 23:15 MWT "How horrible it will be to you, Scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! Because <u>you travel over sea and the dry land to make one proselyte</u> [or, convert to Judaism], and whenever it happens, you make him twice as much a son of Gehenna as you are. [Gehenna was the Valley of Hinnom – a trash dump outside ancient Jerusalem where trash and refuse was thrown. Fires were kept burning to consume the refuse. Being thrown there represented eternal destruction by God.]

is difficult to understand the Bible if you don't consider its message from *God's perspective or viewpoint* on the time period it recounts.

Taking another example of the importance of the <u>Bible timeline</u>: If you had lived 2000 years ago, you could have witnessed Jesus Christ when he presented himself as the Jewish Messiah (the Messiah promised to mankind by the Bible for 4000 years before his birth). That Messianic hope was first promised in the Garden of Eden, the Messiah being identified at that time only as "the seed of the woman." The rest of the Old Testament (OT) (everything after Gen. 3:15 [on about page 3 of the Bible]) provides additional promises and information regarding that coming Messiah. To prove Jesus was God's son (the Messiah) and had authority from God<sup>(17)</sup> to abolish (or to fulfill) the Law so as to establish Christianity, <sup>(6)</sup> you could have seen the miracles Christ performed. Jesus helped all those persons who came to him in *faith*. Had you lived then, you might have been healed by him

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Matthew 8:13 BBE And Jesus said to the captain [centurion], Go in peace; as your faith is, so let it be done to you. And the servant was made well in that hour.~

yourself; or had a loved one who was. Jesus required a change, however, on the part of the Jews who wanted to express faith him. If you had been a Jew or proselyte when Jesus appeared, you would have needed to abandon the form of worship you had previously followed, and put faith in Jesus and his teachings. <sup>10 & (6)</sup> Even though your forefathers had worshiped God acceptably for 1500 years through their Jewish religion and law code, you would have had to abandon their faith and convert to Christianity. <sup>11</sup> You could have had a measure of pride in knowing your nation, and their form of worship, had been used by God to produce the Savior of mankind (Jesus was born as a child of the Jewish nation). <sup>(6)</sup> You would still, however, have needed to abandon faith

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Matthew 13:55-58 CEV Isn't he the son of the carpenter? Isn't Mary his mother, and aren't James, Joseph, Simon, and Judas his brothers? (56) Don't his sisters still live here in our town? How can he do all this?" (57) So the people were very unhappy because of what he was doing. But Jesus said, "Prophets are honored by everyone, except the people of their hometown and their own family." (58) And because the people did not have any faith, Jesus did not work many miracles there.

in Judaistic practices. Christ made that change at the direction of his Father<sup>12</sup> יהוה. (17) was the well-known God of the pre-Christian Jews. (17) The scriptures helping us understand that should also make clear: Where we live in time matters! The form of worship we must practice depends, to some extent, on when

we are alive in the Bible's record of the 6000 years since Adam and Eve were created. 13 To understand the Bible, you should begin by understanding it as a revelation of the history of mankind, which history also reflects the outworking of God's purpose to save his creation (including us you). Our having a faith that can preserve us alive14 is dependent on our understanding what God is doing. That's one thing Jesus came to give us, knowledge about his Father. 15

Gaining the understanding that it matters when we live can also help you appreciate why this is the most wonderful time to be alive in all mankind's history (if, that is, you are a person who loves the truth). Since we will be considering the Bible's recorded history, including both the 4000 years before Christ was born and the 2000 years since his birth, we need to identify the Creator who dealt with mankind for that first 4000 years. הוה, (17) the God of the Hebrew Scriptures and the Father of Christ Jesus. 16 had his name recorded in the Old Testament [OT] over 6000 times. An English sounds like word for Jesus's name is Yeshua (transliterated

You will find as you study the Bible, some translations will contain "LORD" in all capital letters (while others use "Jehovah" as an attempted English translation). A superstition arose against pronouncing the Divine Name, because of a misapplication of the scripture that warns against taking God's name in vane\* (or misusing it). That superstition resulted in the Divine Name being omitted from some translations of the Bible. When you see

"LORD" in all caps, it identifies the Divine Name הוה appeared in

The self-given authorized Divine Name of the true God of the Bible, as recorded in ancient Hebrew, is 717. (Please visit: JustBibleTruth.com/DoesGodHaveAName.html) When spoken by Hebrews, to English speakers the Name sounds like Yea•Vah (that is "Yea" as in Yea go team followed by "Vah" like the first two letters of vault). Some translators erroneously represented the Name as "LORD" in all capital letters, while others attempted to translate it into English as "Jehovah" or as "Yahweh." 717 gave no instructions (or even permission) to attempt to translate his name into any other language.

Father.<sup>18</sup> Knowing them both is necessary as a background to understand what Jesus was sent to teach.<sup>19</sup> That knowledge is also necessary for you to understand your relationship with Jesus, and with his Father.<sup>20</sup> Let us now continue with considering what having faith can mean (or do) for you.

standing here will not die before they see God's kingdom come with power. (2) Six days later Jesus took Peter, James, and John with him. They went up on a high mountain, where they could be alone. (4) Then Moses and Elijah were there talking with Jesus. (5) Peter said to Jesus, "Teacher, it is good for us to be here! Let us make three shelters, one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah." We attempt to scripturally answer the following questions: Can faith<sup>21</sup> save your life? Can faith heal you? Can *your* faith help *other* people? Does what faith can do for you change based on when you have lived in the Bible's record of history? If faith provides you protection, why you and not someone else? Are there things faith *can not* do?<sup>22</sup>

Looking back in Bible history, we note it records different ways faith<sup>(21)</sup> helped individuals in the past. Considering those examples can help us understand how faith can or might benefit us! The Bible recounts, for example, that a woman who lived during the days of Christ's preaching (33 to 36 CE [Christian Era]) suffered with a bleeding problem: (Mark 5:25-26 Modern World Translation [MWT]) Now there was a woman who had suffered from a flow of blood twelve years, 26 and she had been put to many pains by many physicians and had spent all her resources and had not been benefited but, rather, had gotten worse. How might faith help such a woman, and what might have contributed to her having enough faith to help herself?

This woman was a Jew (a Hebrew) and so she grew up studying parts of the Old Testament (the portion of the Bible which existed in her day - including its inspired account of Jewish history). She would have been aware of the examples therein set down of the power of God's spirit, such as one of the miracles connected with God's prophet Elisha (about 3000 years ago, or around 857 BCE [Before the Christian Era]): (2 Kings 13:20-21) "After that Elisha died and they buried him. And there were marauding bands of the Moabites that regularly came into the land at the coming in of the year. 21 And it came about as they were burying a man, why, here

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me everything, and he is the only one who knows the Son. The only one who truly knows the Father is the Son. But the Son wants to tell others about the Father, so that they can know him too.

they saw the marauding band. At once they threw the man into Elisha's burial place and went off. When the man touched the bones of Elisha, he immediately came to life and stood upon his feet." In that Bible account, no faith was required as both Elisha and the unnamed resurrected man were already dead. Reading that and similar scriptures no doubt helped that woman with the flow of blood to have faith, however. It helped her build faith great things could be accomplished through the power of God's spirit. She would also have been taught the Jewish Bible prophecies about the coming Messiah, <sup>23</sup> and she no doubt heard<sup>24</sup> about Jesus and the powerful works he was doing in her

her fountain of blood dried up, and she sensed in her body that she had been healed of the grievous sickness." We who live today are favored to have both the record of Elisha and the others recorded in the Old Testament; as well as the account of this woman (and other faithful Christians) in the New Testament. That scriptural knowledge<sup>(7)</sup> can favor us with a faith based on a lot more information than this sick woman had when she approached Jesus. As this inspired Bible record<sup>(67)</sup> tells us, the woman was able to draw יהוה 's<sup>(17)</sup> spirit by means of her faith in his promised Messiah – without Jesus even being aware what she was about to do. Jesus noticed her only after he perceived spirit go out of him: (Luke 8:42-48) . . . "As he was going the crowds thronged him. 43 And a woman, subject to a flow of blood for twelve years, who had not been able to get a cure from anyone, 44 approached from behind and touched the fringe of his outer garment, and instantly her flow of blood stopped. 45 So Jesus said: 'Who was it that touched me?' When they were all denying it, Peter said: 'Instructor, the crowds are hemming you in and closely pressing you.' 46 Yet Jesus said: 'Someone touched me, for I perceived that power went out of me.' 47 Seeing that she had not escaped notice, the woman came trembling and fell down before him and disclosed before all the people the cause for which she touched him and how she was healed instantly. 48 But he said to her: 'Daughter, your faith has made you well; go your way in peace.'" It seems unlikely this would have been a ruse by Jesus to pretend he did not know what the woman was doing until he felt God's spirit pass through him. The inspired record of his sincere effort to ascertain who touched him was also to help us understand the arrangement Jesus was in the process of establishing: A way for his followers to have a direct relationship with his Father based on their faith in him as the savior sent by God. (27) Jesus said at John 16:23-24: "And in that day you will ask me no question at all. Most truly I say to you, If you ask the Father for anything he will give it to you in my name. 24 Until this present time you have not asked a single thing in my name. Ask and you will receive, that your joy may be made full." Jesus also said at John 15:7-10: "If you remain

in union with me and my sayings remain in you, ask whatever you wish and it will take place for you. 8 My Father is glorified in this, that you keep bearing much fruit and prove yourselves my disciples. 9 Just as the Father has loved me and I have loved you, remain in my love. 10 If you observe my commandments, you will remain in my love, just as I have observed the commandments of the Father and remain in his love."

Please note Jesus said: (Matthew 4:4) ..."It is written, 'Man must live, not on bread alone, but on every utterance coming forth through 'הוֹה' 's<sup>(17)</sup> mouth."" Many Bibles don't use God's name here, but reference Bibles (using footnotes by the Bible scholars who produced the translation) tell us that when Jesus said "it is written" here in Mat 4:4, he was quoting from Deuteronomy 8:3: [from the 1889 Darby Bible translation] "And he humbled thee, and suffered thee to hunger, and fed thee with the manna, which thou hadst not known, and which thy fathers knew not; that he might make thee know that man doth not live by bread alone, but by everything that goeth out of the mouth of Jehovah [הוֹה'] doth man live." Jesus was the perfect son of God, and spoke only what he learned from his Father. 27 Because of that, we can consider

everything Jesus said as absolute truth. The truth Jesus spoke can be considered law just as surely as gravity is law. When Jesus said there is more happiness in giving than in receiving, <sup>28</sup> for example, you can know being selfish will never make you happy. What Jesus teaches us about building faith is real, and the faith we build becomes our God given and only hope! In the account about the woman with the flow of blood, that woman surely believed every word from God was true. She put complete faith in the promises of God as she knew them from the Bible, and so she became convinced she could be healed from her illness if she could just touch the outer garment of the one she believed knew to be God's son and the promised Messiah.<sup>29</sup> She literally healed herself [using God's spirit] by means of her faith. Jesus appreciated that and commended her faith. As Mark's parallel account recorded this event for us: (Mark 5:30-34) 'Immediately, also, Jesus recognized in himself that power had gone out of him, and he turned about in the crowd and began to say: "Who touched my outer garments?" 31 But his disciples began to say to him: "You see the crowd pressing in upon you, and do you say, 'Who touched me?" 32 However, he was looking around to see her that had done this. 33 But the woman, frightened and trembling, 30

Go in peace, and be in good health from your grievous sickness."' Take special note Jesus there told the woman it was her faith that made her well. She was very literally living by the words [by her faith in the Hebrew Scriptures] that came forth from הוה 'sc(17) mouth; living by her demonstrated faith in those words! (Mat 4:4 on pg 13)

In another example, a man who had faith came to Jesus seeking help for his servant who was ill: (Matthew 8:5-10 & 13) 'When he entered into Capernaum, an army officer came to him, entreating him 6 and saying: "Sir, my manservant is laid up in the house with paralysis, being terribly tormented." 7 He said to him: "When I get there I will cure him." 8 In reply the army officer said: "Sir, I am not a fit man for you to enter under my roof, but just say the word and my manservant will be healed. 9 For I too am a man placed under authority, having soldiers under me, and I say to this one, 'Be on your way!' and he is on his way, and to another, 'Come!' and he comes, and to my slave, 'Do this!' and he does it." 10 Hearing that, Jesus became amazed and said to those following him: "I tell you the truth, with no one in Israel have I found so great a faith... 13 Then Jesus said to the army officer: "Go. Just as it has been your faith, so let it come to pass for you." And the manservant was healed in that hour.'

(10) So the chief priests made plans to kill Lazarus too, (11) because on his account many Jews were rejecting them and believing in Jesus.

Please understand what Jesus told this army officer about faith: That it would happen for him just as he (in his faith) had imagined it. This was a man with a military command such that he told people what to do and they did it. He thus rightly reasoned the son of God would not have to make the journey to his home to heal his servant. (He also showed humility in stating he was not a fit man for Jesus to enter his home.) Surely, this man's faith helped him, and his servant. His faith actually helped him to plan out what was to happen for him, and then it happened, even though it was not the way Jesus had initially intended to help him. Jesus intended to go the man's home and heal his servant. The man had faith, however, that Jesus could just say the word and it would be so. The power of faith<sup>31</sup> is not to be underestimated... It seems limited only by - well - our faith.<sup>32</sup>

Make no mistake, faith is a powerful tool as a gift from our Creator. It is just as Jesus said at Mark 11:23: [MWT] ..."All the things you pray and ask for have faith that you have practically received, and you will have them." That means, of course, you must know from the Bible what it is appropriate for you to have faith in, so your request will be in agreement with God's purposes.<sup>33</sup> (We do not here assert you will be able to use God's spirit to calm the raging sea or raise the dead. We do not, on the

other hand, assert our judgment over Holy Spirit so as to proclaim what faithful Christians will or will not be able to do. From the Bible history we have considered, it seems a personal matter for each Christian, as long as our request is for what God wants for us. Jesus said: [John 15:8 GNB] My Father's glory is shown by your bearing much fruit; and in this way you become my disciples. Based on that scripture, then, we can always pray for God to help us bear fruit; by telling others what we learn from Jesus.) God is helping mankind by means of the message brought by his son. (19) We can pray to assist in that work.

Jesus was clear about one thing the gift of Holy Spirit would accomplish in his followers during these last days. He said he would send us a helper, the "spirit of truth" that would remain forever.34 Jesus further said that helper would call to mind and help us understand the things he had taught us.<sup>35</sup> Those promises

by Jesus indicate we can ask our Father for what we know from the Bible to be in harmony with his will, and it will simply come to pass. It thus becomes important to know our being happy is God's will!<sup>36</sup> Our living forever is God's will.<sup>37</sup> Among the things the spirit can do, according to Jesus, then, is keep us alive forever.<sup>(39 & 40)</sup> The "spirit of truth" can bring to mind all the promises of Jah הווים "ווים" של "ווים". We can, in turn, stay alive forever through our faith in

It doesn't seem reasonable to introduce the idea that some of us will have the opportunity to live forever without providing scriptural support for saying such a thing. We herein consider one last and very important Bible example. This is a conversation Jesus had with Martha just before he resurrected her brother Lazarus.<sup>41</sup> In this account we find two sisters with a brother who was sick. The sisters had faith in Jesus, and so they sent for him to heal their brother: (John 11:1-6 Good News Bible) (1) 'A man named Lazarus, who lived in Bethany, became sick. Bethany was the town where Mary and her sister Martha lived. (2) [This Mary was the one who poured the perfume on the Lord's feet and wiped them with her hair; it was her brother Lazarus who was sick.] (3) The sisters sent Jesus a message: "Lord, your dear friend is sick." (4) When Jesus heard it, he said, "The final result of this sickness will not be the death of Lazarus; this has happened in order to bring glory to God, and it will be the means by which the Son of God will receive glory." (5) Jesus loved Martha and her sister and Lazarus.

# (6) Yet when he received the news that Lazarus was sick, he stayed where he was for two more days.'

Note Jesus loved Mary and Martha and Lazarus, so... Why would he stay two additional days before going to help them? Jesus also said the purpose of Lazarus' sickness was not death, but for the glory of he and his Father. We find, however, Lazarus did die! Reading from John 11:20-22: 'Therefore Martha, when she heard that Jesus was coming, met him; but Mary kept sitting at home. 21 Martha therefore said to Jesus: "Lord, if you had been here my brother would not have died. 22 And yet at present I know that as many things as you ask God for, God will give you." Jesus told Martha her brother would rise from the dead, and she acknowledge a *future* day when the dead would be resurrected: (John 11:23-24) 'Jesus said to her: "Your brother will rise." 24 Martha said to him: "I know he will rise in the resurrection on the last day." Jesus next made the statement to Martha which should be of great interest to each of us who are trying to build faith. Jesus said the resurrection would be through him, and that the faithful alive at the time of his coming with kingdom power to perform the resurrection would never die at all, but would receive eternal life - without having to die. Following in John 11:2-7: 'Jesus said to her: "I am the resurrection and the life. He that exercises faith in me, even though he dies, will come to life; 26 and everyone that is living and exercises faith in me will never die at all. Do you believe this?" 27 She said to him: "Yes, Lord; I have believed that you are the Christ the Son of God, the one coming into the world." Jesus there told Martha those living at the time of his second coming<sup>42</sup> (and who manifest faith) would

never die at all. Do YOU have faith that is truth?<sup>43</sup> Do you begin to grasp what your faith can mean for you if you do?

Jesus next shows what he had meant when he said Lazarus' sickness had not been for the purpose of death, but to bring glory to him and his Father. Next, Jesus publicly demonstrated what the (then future) "final day" resurrection would be like, as he brought to life a man who had been dead four days: (John 11:38-45) 'Hence Jesus, after groaning again within himself, came to the memorial tomb. It was, in fact, a cave, and a stone was lying against it. 39 Jesus said: "Take the stone away." Martha, the sister of the deceased, said to him: "Lord, by now he must smell, for it is four days." 40 Jesus said to her: "Did I not tell you that if you would believe you would see the glory of God?" 41 Therefore they took the stone away. Now Jesus raised his eyes heavenward and said: "Father, I thank you that you have heard me. 42 True, I knew that you always hear me; but on account of the crowd standing around I spoke, in order that they might believe that you sent me forth." 43 And when he had said these things, he cried out with a loud voice: "Lazarus, come on out!" 44 The [man] that had been dead came out with his feet and hands bound with wrappings, and his countenance was bound about with a cloth (a cloth was around his face). Jesus said to them: "Loose him and let him go." 45 Therefore many of the Jews that had come to Mary and that beheld what he did put faith in him;' Jesus spending additional time before going to resurrect Lazarus seems to have been for the purpose of making the resurrection hope clear to all. After being dead four days, no one could doubt Lazarus was really dead. Also, no one should misunderstand what the resurrection is to be: Because everyone recognized Lazarus to be resurrected as the same man who had died. According to Jesus's own words, then,

this very public resurrection brought glory to both Jesus and his Father יהוה.

By means of the scriptures we have considered, Jesus teaches something wonderful we can build faith in: *A chance to be among those who will never die at all*. Some will point to Hebrews 9:27<sup>44</sup> or Ecclesiastes 3:2<sup>45</sup> and assert we all must die. That is true, *unless Christ intervenes* to stop us having to do so. Job promised a day when that intervention would happen: (Job 33:24-25) 24 Then he favors him and says, 'Let him off from going down into the pit! I have found a ransom! 25 Let his flesh become fresher than in youth; Let him return to the days of his youthful vigor.' That scripture holds out the hope of an escape from death. (Also, in a sense, we have all been dead already. We have been dead in our sins. <sup>46</sup> Being baptized<sup>47</sup> into Christ [by our exercising faith in his resurrection] <sup>48</sup> figuratively resurrects us from the

Just as in the Bible examples we considered above, for you to receive the benefit of Jesus's promises, you must have faith what he said is true... Bible prophecy and world events suggest we have arrived at the time<sup>49</sup> when those who are righteously inclined will receive the reward.<sup>50</sup> The Bible promises those with eyes of faith will be witness to salvation standing up<sup>51</sup> for the meek and righteous persons of the earth.<sup>52</sup> As Jesus said: (Matthew 24:37 & 39) "For just as the days of Noah were, so the presence of the Son of man will be. . . and they took no note until the flood came and swept them all away." Peter added at 1 Peter 3:20 [KJV]: ... "the longsuffering of God waited in the days of Noah, while the ark was a preparing, wherein few, that is, eight souls [lives] were saved by water. The figurative ark of salvation for our

unfolding and revealing itself over the Bible record of mankind's six thousand years from Adam until today.<sup>57</sup> God's previous actions to help individuals (by healing them or by a temporary resurrection) have been in some measure so others could have hope because of what happened to them; a hope based in faith God is establishing the Kingdom of Christ.<sup>58</sup> As for our day, we should recognize the kingdom has been established. (58) That kingdom is helping (those with faith), and will continue to help forever.<sup>59</sup> The man resurrected when he was thrown into Elisha's grave was largely for the purpose of building faith in those who lived during his day, and in us who read the account after his day. There is no record of a stream of the dead being thrown into the grave of Elisha and being resurrected. (It is likely some did try to

Hebrews 10:38 & 39 tell us to do exactly that: "For you have need of endurance, in order that, after you have done the will of God, you may receive the fulfillment of the promise. 37 For yet "a very little while," and "he who is coming will arrive and will not delay." 38 "But my righteous one will live by reason of faith," and, "if he shrinks back, my soul has no pleasure in him." 39 Now we are not the sort that shrink back to destruction, but the sort that have faith to the preserving alive of the soul." Is that scripture one you will use to plan out (and have faith) how God's spirit will help you? We all face problems that can seem overwhelming! If you suffer any of the terrible problems common to mankind, 62 the following are some scriptures you might choose to meditate on: Psalms 27:12-14 Darby Deliver me not over to the will of mine adversaries; for false witnesses are risen up against me, and such as breathe out violence. Some people assert there is no need for you to make the effort and take the time to learn what the Bible teaches. They will present some subset of the scriptures and claim faith in those few scriptures is enough.<sup>64</sup> They might, as the simplest example, tell you to "Believe on the name of the lord Jesus and be saved," as

they quote Acts 16:31.65 That scripture is truth of course! Some persons believe that is the only Bible verse you need to learn. If they can be acceptable to our Father with such logic, it is certainly fine with us. 66 We are left wondering why God inspired the balance of the Bible to be recorded. 67 & (131) The Bible itself explains why being familiar with everything Jesus taught is important: "This means everlasting life, their taking in knowledge of you the only true God, and the one you sent forth Christ Jesus". (John 17:3) That scripture clearly states we must know (take in knowledge of) Jesus and his Father. (20) (Of course, God is fair and will make provision for those who have not had opportunity to learn.) Jesus also said "if [and only if] you remain in my teachings, you are really my disciples."(131) How could you possibly remain in Jesus's teachings if you didn't know what they were? It seems questionable whether knowledge of one (or even several) scriptures can grant knowledge necessary for real faith. "All scripture is inspired by God and beneficial..." (2 Tim 3:16)(67) If there were a shortcut version of truth, Jesus would have taught that. He came to teach just what we need to know. We should

As to our opening assertion that our message is both important and different from what you have previously heard, this paragraph summarizes how and why that is so. Building and then possessing faith in the Bible is the most important opportunity of life. (3) & (18) You can't buy it, steal it, coerce it, or be granted it by powerful groups or individuals. It is a gift from our Father, freely and equally offered to everyone. All we need do is accept it by acting in faith built on familiarity with Jesus's teachings. 69 Your

reason it is not arrogant on our part to say our message is very important for you, then, is because we do our best to teach what Jesus Christ taught; including his warning about the danger of being misled by the teachings of men.<sup>73</sup> Some avowed Christians are really only seeking glory from and among their sectarian group.<sup>74</sup> They are simply not able to teach what Jesus taught, if they are mixing it with sectarian organizational teachings!<sup>75</sup>

Please consider the example of William Tyndale. In the 1500's, William was responsible for the translation of the Bible into what had become the world's most common language: English.

Williams's efforts helped bring the prophetic decline of the dark ages. 76 Tyndale grew up immersed in the "holy" Roman (apostate) church teachings. As a young man, William told one of the powerful members of the clergy of that sect: "In a short time I will cause a boy who walks behind a plow to know more of the scriptures than you do." William was not arrogant to make that statement. Being exposed to the Bible, William simply realized the clergy members were not trying to teach the people what Jesus taught. That false "church" actually hid the Bible from common people by keeping it in an obscure and dead language (Latin). They misapplied it's teachings to manipulate and control people. They tried to convince most people, like William, they were too ignorant or stupid to understand the Bible on their own. They wanted those they could enslave to rely on their Clergy to "interpret" the Bible for them. (131) The Church did their best to keep people ignorant and dependent, thus bringing about the thousand years of the Dark ages. England had grown from the ruins of Rome to become the world power. But still, the remnants of the apostate Roman Dark Ages Church held much authority. In 1536 CE, just before leaders of the church burned William Tyndale for his English Bible translation, he uttered his last public prayer: That God would open the eyes of the King of England [open his eyes to the damage being done he and his nation by the apostate church]. Within two years, by 1538, King Henry the VIII had placed copies of Tyndale's Bible in every church in England. For the first time since the dark ages (76) was brought about by the apostasy of the church Jesus left, common men and women had access to the Bible in their own language. If you understand the Bible today, you owe your knowledge in part to the sacrifice of William Tyndale. And... You know more of the scriptures than that hypocritical religious leader Mr. Tyndale was speaking with when he mentioned the boy following the plow. William Tyndale was not haughty in saying he could do better than those clergyman in teaching truth. Tyndale simply loved God's word and he

understood what it was for. He knew its power.<sup>77</sup> Modern religion hides the Bible from their "sheep" in a little different way than the church of the dark ages. Instead of keeping it hidden in a dead language, understood only their internally trained scholars, modern religion keeps it buried under sectarian doctrine and dogma. They teach followers to show up once or twice a week to listen to organizational elders, or priests, or anointed individuals, or whatever else they choose to call their clergy.<sup>78</sup> They tell

followers it is alright if they want to study the Bible on their own a little bit, but assert they need the help of the organizations enlightened leaders to really comprehend it. They tell them they are better off reading materials produced by the organization (instead of the Bible). If people can be persuaded to believe such lies, the Bible is effectively hidden in plain sight.

We direct you to Jesus, just as he directs us to his Father. 79 The only group you can join is the

We recommend one additional way faith might help all those who love righteousness:81 Through their joining with others in offering a united prayer. God loves us all! The Bible teaches a righteous person's prayer has great power before our Father.82 Imagine a united prayer being offered up to the true God<sup>(17)</sup> by every righteous person throughout the whole earth! There is an obvious problem with that idea. This old world system smacks of disunity and chaos. The Bible teaches we are not judges of hearts, and therefore, we can not know who among us is righteous.83 (We are able to judge, and thereby avoid, wicked actions; wicked actions being those defined as disapproved by the Bible.)84 The problem for us is that while some individuals are righteous, others are wicked and they will feign righteousness. (73) Yet other people remain ignorant, (7) but also try to appear righteous; that because ignorant people usually imagine they are righteous. An example would be Saul of Tarsus (also known as the apostle Paul). In his early life Paul persecuted and even killed the followers of Christ, doing so in the name of his religion.85 Even though Paul's actions

were wicked, his heart remained upright as he acted in his ignorance.<sup>86</sup> Knowing Paul's heart, in spite of his wicked actions, God loved Paul and reached out (through Jesus) to help him change. Paul thus became useful to spread Jesus's teachings. Following his good response to the truth, Paul was used to write more books of the Bible than any other man. Any who knew Paul before his conversion would have rightly judged him to be wicked in his actions, and by human standards of judgment, a wicked man as well.<sup>87</sup> Trying to join others in a united prayer, then, we

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traveling and coming near Damascus, about midday a bright light from the sky flashed suddenly around me. should start with having humility to understand we are not judges of who is wicked *or who is righteous*. Having that realization, caution is needed as to who we join with in prayer, and caution about who we pray for as well (lest we pray in support of someone fighting against God). Whether "fighters against God" do so in their ignorance, or they do so in their wickedness, we must not support their actions.<sup>88</sup>

In light of the disunity and hatred among those who profess religion,<sup>(72)</sup> then, how can we know who we can join with in prayer, or what common prayer we might offer? In complete unity, all righteously inclined persons can pray for our Father to bless and help the righteous - whoever they may prove to be. We can also pray that God strike down the wicked - without presuming to judge who they are; or setting a timetable for his doing so.<sup>89</sup> We can then be patient because we know הלוה (17) is arranging things so as to save as many as possible through their

expression of faith in Christ!<sup>90</sup> Quoting or paraphrasing any prayer taught us by the Christ (meaning "anointed one") is always acceptable.<sup>(89)</sup> By uttering such harmonious prayers through our faith in Christ Jesus, we can be found among the large group of the faithful<sup>(81)</sup> who are uttering those very same prayers.<sup>(89) & (John 16:23-24 on pg 12)</sup> Those united prayers, in the variety and beauty of heartfelt utterances by each individual, rise as incense before our Heavenly Father from all around the earth, both by day and by night.<sup>91</sup> In the unity of such prayers, we place ourselves in harmony with הוה God<sup>(17)</sup> as he is working to make all things better.<sup>92</sup> All righteous persons must come to realize the wicked have be destroyed before things can get better.<sup>93</sup> And, we must

In light of all these scriptures, we then say: Like no previous time in mankind's history, it is your faith that can preserve you alive in the face of all the terrible things happening in our world.  $^{(49)\,\&\,(14)}$  Each of us should consider whether we have built faith for salvation; and whether we are expending our life's energy in continuing to do so.  $^{96}$  The "Truth," wrapped up in Christ, has been

gradually revealed  $^{97}$  over the six thousand years  $^{(13)}$  of Bible history.  $^{(13)}$ 

What follows is our understanding of the scriptural steps to building faith. It *is not* being presented as the Bible definition of truth on this process. It represents our study, as we attempt to understand how people (we) build faith. The scriptures seem to suggest the following sequence in awakening to truth:<sup>(61)</sup>

**1.** We must start by finding some measure of mental peace in the midst of this calamitous world. It is hard to think about spiritual

things if you are in constant terror. A calm heart (or a mind at peace) is the source of life. 98 Reading the words of Christ Jesus helps grant the reader peace of mind. 99

2. Just the opposite of Christ's teachings, this world is a hurtful place that tends to rob away peace. Satan's design is to upset and unbalance each of us. (Satan's system<sup>100</sup> tries to make a joke of God, and/or, to keep us from thinking about him altogether.<sup>101</sup> Most of what we see in this old world system underscores suffering and death, or immorality and deceit in some form. In recent times there have appeared groups [religious fanatics] who actually promote terrorism.<sup>(100)</sup> Even if we are protected from such people, and are among those who have the best this world has to offer, we still have only 70 or 80 years while we watch

ourselves and those we care for grow old and die.<sup>102</sup> The pressures people are under drive them toward doing things some of them would not otherwise do.<sup>103</sup> A mind at peace, through our faith in God's son, is the only thing that can protect us.)

- **3.** As we make any attempt to be righteous in the midst of the chaos of this world, הוה  $God^{()}$  takes note of that effort. <sup>104</sup>
- **4.** God then directs all righteously inclined individuals to the teachings of his Son Christ Jesus. <sup>105</sup> Jesus willingly gave *his life* to bring the message that can grant life to each of us. <sup>106</sup> (God did, of

5. As we study to learn what Jesus taught, Christ sends us a

**6.** The helper sent by Jesus calls to mind and helps us make sense of his teachings (based on our effort to learn what he taught). As the spirit of truth grants us an understanding <sup>109</sup> of Gospel teachings, that understanding orders and organizes our mind. <sup>(6)</sup> We put on the mind of Christ, as it were. <sup>110</sup> Bible knowledge is

upbuilding and encouraging. It promises our return to youth<sup>(39)</sup> and living forever,<sup>(39)</sup> while our Father cares eternally for our needs.<sup>(60)</sup> Choosing to pattern your mind on what Jesus said both organizes and restores it.

7. Such an ordered mind, in turn, provides the perfect dwelling place for God's spirit.<sup>111</sup> (To remain a suitable host for the "helper" Jesus sent, we must be vigilant to remain faithful to the truth of the Bible.<sup>(131)</sup> We must avoid being misled by the teachings of men.<sup>112</sup> We need to make our own personal effort to put on the mind of Christ [by reading over and over what he taught].)<sup>113 & (73)</sup> Our Father's spirit will then be present to aid all who thus make themselves his friends,<sup>114</sup> in any of the many ways it helped his friends of Bible record. And, it will help in ways we can't even fathom (all in answer to our prayers offered in unison


